
LITERACY LEARNING PROGRESSIONS

Learning basic skills like reading, writing, spelling, adding and subtracting generally happen in a certain order. On the Australian Curriculum website, the literacy and numeracy progressions show the order that most children develop these skills.

Use the literacy and numeracy learning progressions to see where your child might be up to in their development of a particular skill (like learning to write a full sentence) and see the next typical step of development.

How your child learns to create texts Creates letter-like shapes and strings. Draws pictures and shapes Writes some recognisable letters. Talks about why people write Writes own recognisable name or personally significant words. Writes from left to right and top to bottom Writes left to right using spaces between words. Writes a small range of familiar common words

Uses logical word order in sentences. Makes plausible attempts to write unfamiliar words phonetically
